Unlocking the potential of the Romanian ESCO market:
Energy Performance Contracts

Energy Performance Contracting (EPC) - i.e. a contractual arrangement between the beneficiary and the provider of an energy efficiency improvement measure, whereby the investment in the agreed measure is paid back in relation to an agreed level of energy efficiency improvement or other agreed energy performance criteria (such as financial savings) – is a prerequisite to the sustainable and accelerated growth of an ESCO market.

With insufficient financing mechanisms or incentive schemes available, EPCs are then a key instrument to tap into the huge savings potential in public buildings, and could also spur developments in energy efficiency of the industrial and tertiary sector.

The workshop aims to take a deep dive into the practical aspects of energy performance contracting, from both the beneficiaries (albeit private or public institutions) and the providers perspective, reveal how the regulatory framework can spur investments and what are the barriers encountered so far.
